Barona Fire Protection District was established in 1998 to provide its own dedicated fire service to the residents and patrons of the Barona Reservation. The District initially began with six members and now has 20 full-time fire personnel and one administrative person. Barona Fire Station was completed in 2000. The station is approximately 9000 sq feet and houses four administrative offices, eight beds for on-duty personnel, and three double-deep drive-through apparatus bays.

Fire Chief Randy Sandoval sought an alternative water system after the station's water softener failed. Chlorine in the water deteriorated the softener, causing the water to turn brown. Mary Ann Mercer, the purchasing agent for the Barona Tribe of Indians, suggested LifeSource Water Systems as the solution. She oversaw the acquisition of two hundred systems within the tribal community. Following Mercer's advice, Chief Sandoval had two systems installed in tandem in the Barona Fire Station 27. He along with the other firefighters are amazed by the clarity of the water and the delicious, clean taste. They use the water for drinking, bathing, and cooking.
